



Waste Management Policy

Rationale/Responsibilities

The Management Committee, Advisory Committee and Staff at Whitgift Special Needs Activity Project recognise the need to manage waste responsibly, in order to reduce pollution, conserve natural resources and develop sustainable practice for the future.

Whitgift SNAP recognises the role it can play in educating our staff and volunteers about the importance of managing waste responsibly, through the charity's strategies and through examples in daily practice.

As a charity we are aware of the leading role we must take in the drive towards sustainable living and environmental awareness and as a result we have ensured that Whitgift SNAP has focused on reducing waste production by reusing and recycling materials wherever possible.

Mission

We aim to reduce the waste produced by the charity to the bare minimum. Whitgift SNAP will recycle all materials possible. Other waste products will be reused or composted where feasible.

Aims:

To recycle a wide range of materials, including: Glass, Plastic, Paper, Cardboard, Textiles, Aluminium and Printer Cartridges.

To reuse materials where possible.

To compost food waste and other appropriate materials where possible.

To discourage littering both inside and outside.

To provide well-maintained facilities to encourage responsible waste management and recycling.

To encourage an awareness of the need for responsible waste management, with regards to environmental impact, pollution and sustainable living.

Methods

We plan to achieve our aims through:

Displaying a copy of the charity's Waste Management Policy and Environmental Policy on site and on our website, as a reminder to recycle.

Displaying posters on site to discourage dropping litter.

Endeavour to provide numerous bins throughout the school grounds to encourage responsible management of waste.
